

# **General Information**

See the Fairgrounds map on the next page for key event locations.

All camping spaces are on a first come first served basis. Tent camping is allowed on grass areas. For those with RVs we will have lots of sites with electric and water, and for campers four different grassy tent camping areas. If you are tent camping, we ask that you do not set up camp in the RV spots please. If you have an RV, make sure you place the RV tag that you receive at registration in your front window. Also, please do not move picnic tables from their locations.

There are men's and women's showers in several locations (see the rally map). Please be courteous and limit your shower times so everyone has hot water, especially during the morning hours!

We have a few simple rules that will ensure everyone has a great time at the Rally. Thankfully, we don't have many problems.

- 1. Be respectful of your fellow rally attendees and the volunteers
- 2. Recognize this event is put on entirely by volunteers. Be sure and thank them for their service.
- 3.Leave your campsite as you found it.

4. Respect quite hours between 10 PM and 8 AM. If you are in an RV, keep your generators off during that time.

5. Enjoy the beer garden in moderation and refrain from illegal drug use. If you've had too much, we won't serve you and you may be asked to sleep it off.

6. Be careful when riding on the fairgrounds and keep your speed below 5MPH.

7. If you observe unsafe or inappropriate conduct, please bring it to the attention of one of the Board Members or Rally Chair.

8. You must have a valid Motorcycle License to ride in the fairgrounds

If the Rally Committee determines you aren't following these rules, you may be asked to leave the event.


Rally HQ / Club Store is open Thursday afternoon and all day Friday - Sunday.



<sup>(1)</sup> Richard Leevey will lead this ride on Friday morning (meetup 9 am, depart 9.30 sharp) but you can do the route any time on your own. From the fairgrounds it's 2 miles to Chandler rd. where we jump onto the 12 miles of wide, well used, well-maintained dirt logging roads that take us up over Hough mountain and into Taylorsville. From there It's 10 miles of paved road to get us to the next section of offroad which is14 miles of wide-open well-maintained gravel roads up to Antelope lake. We'll take a loop around the lake with a rest stop to enjoy the scenery before heading down the 20 miles of the twisty paved Indian Creek rd. and back to Taylorsville. We'll stop at the Taylorsville store for a beverage and snack break before taking Arlington rd. and hwy 89 S. back to the fairgrounds. The total loop is about 93 miles. The ride time is approximately 3 1/2 hours but it's reasonable to add two hours of breaks for a total of 5 1/2 hours. We should be back to the fairgrounds by 3 PM.

Asphalt Trials will run from 1:00pm-2:30pm at the front parking lot. The course will test your slow-speed bike handling on the tarmac. You will have to navigate a variety of cone-based challenges including tight turns, U-turns, figure 8's, and slaloms all without dabbing. All bikes and skill levels are welcome.



Slow Races will run from 2:30pm-3:00pm at the front parking lot. The slow race will test your ability to ride as slowly as possible without putting your foot down.
You will have to master balance and clutch control all while staying in your lane.
The last person across the finish line wins. All bikes and skill levels are welcome.

# Sunday Highlights

English Trials will run from 9 am to 11:30 am at the Hillside. Pre-register at Rally HQ. This event tests riders' technical skills and balance as they compete to negotiate obstacles in the shortest time with the fewest foot dabs. Riders are scored and prizes are awarded. Reputations are made and ruined. Water balloons are sometimes thrown. This is a crowd favorite so don't miss it.



GS Giants Challenge will run from 1:00 pm to 3 pm at the Hillside. Pre-register at Rally HQ. This event is for riders with intermediate to advanced off-road skills, and navigates tight turns, water/mud hazards and varied terrain. Riders are scored and prizes are awarded. Spectators are welcome. Water balloons will not be thrown but who knows, you might see the next Ricky Brabec in action.



Today is your last chance to do a Poker Run. Same deal as for Saturday but you must finish playing your poker hand by 1 pm at the Beer Garden.



We will wrap up the official Rally festivities with an Awards and Closing Ceremony at the Old Town from 4:00 pm – 5:00 pm. This includes raffle prizes. Must be present to win.

There is no dinner service on Sunday night.

Monday is pack up and go day. Fairgrounds close at 12 noon.
