MEET OUR INSTRUCTORS:

OFFICER JAMES AYRES

Motor Training Officer James Ayres has been a police officer for 18 years. He has been a Motor Officer for 8 years and is currently riding a BMW GS850 for the department. He has been a member of the Irvine PD Major Accident Investigation Team for 9 years. He is a certified Emergency Vehicle Operations Instructor, Motor Instructor, and Dual Sport Motor Instructor. He has been riding motorcycles ranging from dirt bikes to Harleys for over 13 years.



OFFICER TYLER HOLLENBECK

Motor Officer Hollenbeck is a certified California police motorcycle instructor with 8 years of law enforcement experience and is on the Major Accident investigation Team. He grew up riding dirt bikes in the Pacific Northwest and now has 24 years of combined riding experience. Officer Hollenbeck is also a certified California dual-sport motorcycle instructor and currently rides a BMW GS850 for the police department.



OFFICER JASON SCHEAFER

Motor Training Officer Scheafer is a 20 year veteran of IPD. He is a California POST certified motorcycle instructor. His duties include training new motor officers in developing proper riding skills, overseeing continuing training of current motor officers, and teaching new police officers traffic enforcement/investigations during their field training. Motor Training Officer Scheafer also oversees many of the bicycle safety initiatives conducted by Irvine PD, which includes E-Bike safety training for Irvine youths.



OFFICER PHILLIP WALSH

Motor officer Walsh has been a police officer for the City of Irvine for 20 years. He became a police officer after serving 5 years in the USMC as an Infantry Machine Gunner which included a combat tour in Iraq 2004. He is currently a police motorcycle instructor and firearms instructor. Motor Officer Walsh recently purchased a BMW GSA 1250 for enjoyment in his personal time and plans to do several road trips around the United States on his motorcycle.
